Governor Bart Henson

Our forefathers and foremothers were brave, determined and loving people who left their lives, homes, friends and all familiar surroundings in England and Holland to seek religious freedom and start new lives here in America in the wilderness. To borrow from the words of a later group (the framers of the American Declaration of Independence), the Mayflower Pilgrims risked “their lives and fortunes” in their determination to establish a place where they and their children would be able to worship God as they felt called to do.

Quoting William Bradford in his Of Plymouth Plantation, “*Having thus passed over the vast ocean, and that sea of troubles before while they were making their preparations, they now had no friends to welcome them, nor inns to*

entertain and refresh their weatherbeaten bodies, nor houses – much less towns – to repair to.”

Despite half of them dying in this endeavor over the 1620-1621 winter in Plymouth and other severe struggles and realities, they succeeded in leading the creation of a country with religious freedom!!

I am humbled and privileged to follow in the footsteps of these Pilgrims as the new Governor of the Texas Society.

I am also privileged to follow in the footsteps of Linda Hill and the long line of Texans who have led our Society since 1931. While I am not a native Texan, I did, as the saying goes, “get here as quickly as I could” after college and I am married to a Yellow Rose of Texas. It is also special to me since my uncle was Governor of the Alabama Society of Mayflower Descendants before me.

Appreciation is due to the outgoing state officers, colony officers, committee chairs and members who advanced our Society in the last two years. To them, as I speak for all of us, a huge “Thank you!”. We are a stronger society, now with eight colonies, just over 900 members and we are financially sound. The Annual Meeting in Round Rock was a success and gave many of us the opportunity to renew friendships.

Looking forward, I would like to focus on two things during my two year term:

1. Strengthen the Colonies. I plan to visit each of our eight colonies at least once during my two year term and to work sharing good ideas among the colonies. So far I have had the privilege of visiting with the Amarillo and Corpus Christi colonies. If you are not a member of a colony, I highly recommend joining one of them. The fellowship and connections are great and the programs are interesting!

2. Increase the scope and effectiveness of our Education activities, so that we may truly honor our Pilgrim ancestors. It falls to us to “pass on” the noble and interesting story of how our forefathers and foremothers helped plant the greatest nation on earth. Let’s honor them by doing this!

There being a quorum present, Governor Linda Hill called the General Meeting of the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of Texas to order at 9:00 AM on March 31, 2007.

Reports were made by many of the officers, the standing committee heads, and the Colonies.

2007 State Meeting Motions

Motions at the 2007 Annual Meeting of Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of Texas

“A list of the motions presented at the Annual and Board of Assistants/Directors Meetings and their disposition shall be published in the Newsletter after approval by the Governor/President.” *SOMD TX Bylaws, Article VIII, Section 3-E*

Board of Assistant’s Meeting - March 30, 2007

The Board of Assistants meeting was held on March 30, 2007, in Round Rock, Texas. There were no motions made at the meeting.

General Meeting -March 31, 2007

The Assembly agreed to follow Rules of Order: Article XII, Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised, in the absence of controlling bylaws, shall be followed. Motions are to be submitted in writing. Debate: Members may speak twice on a motion, but only after others have spoken. Debate is limited to two minutes per person per motion.

Treasurer Ron Moranville presented the Treasurer’s Report and moved that it be accepted. Motion carried.

Bart Henson moved that we amend the standing rules by adding a rule stating: “The Society will acquire and maintain appropriate directors and officers liability insurance.” Motion carried.

Bart Henson moved to add Standing Rule 16 to read: “The Treasurer shall, within two months after his election, furnish at the expense of the SOMD Texas a suitable fidelity bond from an acceptable fidelity or guaranty insurance company, payable to SOMD Texas.” Motion carried.

Leah Davis asked permission to order books for the Longview Library since the cost will come out of this year’s budget instead of last year’s. Permission was granted.

Hallie Garner moved that the actual changes in the Bylaws and Standing Rules be approved by the assembly. Motion carried. Hallie Garner also moved that they be published in the next newsletter. Motion carried. Hallie Garner then moved that a committee be authorized to review the bylaws and amend, if necessary. Motion carried.

Leah Davis, chairman of the nomination committee, presented the slate of nominated officer for the years 2007-2009. Governor Linda Hill asked for nominations from the floor. There were none. Leah Davis moved that the slate be elected by acclamation. Motion carried and officers duly elected.

Bart Henson nominated Jerry Dalton to be the chairman of the Nomination Committee for the election to be held in 2009. Motion carried.

The Board of Assistants recommends that \$1,000.00 be donated to Pilgrim Hall Museum in honor of Lola McDaniel. The General Assembly accepted this proposal.

Board of Assistants Meeting - March 31, 2007

Governor Bart Henson called the Board of Assistants meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

The first business was to verify the budget and then to confirm the appointment of chairmen.

Dewitt Alsup moved that the appointed chairmen be confirmed. Motion was seconded by Marcia Skillern. Motion carried.

Governor Henson will work with the appointed chairmen to fill out the committees.

The chairman of the Finance Committee, Charles Prince, moved that the previously read and discussed budget be adopted. Motion was seconded by Ken Wood. Motion carried.

Mary Eck, Recording Secretary, called attention to the old records that could be placed at the Institute of Texas Cultures under the direction of the University of Texas at San Antonio. Ken Wood moved that the records be placed at this location. Jerry Dalton seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The Governor entertained a motion to adjourn. Dewitt Alsup moved the adjournment with a second from Ken Wood. Motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 4:45 p.m.

2007 ByLaws Changes

ByLaws Committee: Committee Chairman Hallie Garner submitted the following changes:

Article III: Membership Section 2-B, Junior Membership, shall read: A member in good standing may make application for Junior Membership on behalf of any person under eighteen years of age who is related by blood to that member through the line on which such member was approved for membership in the Society.

Sec. 3: Junior Members under age 18 may become Life Members upon payment of the Life Membership fee of \$625.00 and after complying with all procedures for regular membership as set forth in Article III, Section 1A. A Junior member of the Texas Society shall become a Life member after the approval of lineage papers by the state Historian and the Historian General and after Texas and General Society numbers have been assigned. The Preliminary Application for the Junior member moving to become a Life member shall read: Application Fee, Seventy-five Dollars), Life Membership Fee, Six Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$625.00), Total, Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00)

Sec. 4: No Member under the age of eighteen (18) years may vote or hold office in the Texas State Society or in the General Society.

Article IV: Section IV: Officers. Section 2. Term of Office. Officers shall be elected by a majority vote in odd numbers years at the annual meeting and shall serve for a term of two years or until their successors are elected. All officers, except the Governor and Deputy Governor, may serve more than one consecutive term in the same office. No officers, except the Historian, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, may serve more than two consecutive terms in the office. These officers may serve three terms.

Section 3 – Vacancy in Office. A vacancy in the office of the Governor/President shall be filled by the Deputy Governor. The vacancy thus created in the office of the Deputy Governor, and any other vacancy in the elected officers or elected committee chairmen, shall be filled by appointment by the Governor/President and affirmed by majority vote of the Board of Assistants/Directors at its next regular meeting. Any person who serves more than half a term shall be deemed to have served a full term.

Section 6. Duties of Officers. A-12: In the event of an unforeseeable circumstance rendering any elected officer, or elected committee chairman, unable to perform his or her duties, the Governor, with the agreement of the Board of Assistants by correspondence, may appoint a replacement and/or assistant, as may fit the situation, with this action being ratified at the next Board of Assistants meeting.

Old 12 becomes 13.

Section D. 8. The Corresponding Secretary will have custody of the Preliminary Application (PA) forms and the Preliminary Lineage Review (PLR) forms.

11. The Corresponding Secretary will send the Preliminary Lineage Review (PLR) forms with instructions to applicants who have paid the required fee and notify, in writing, the Governor/President, Historian, Treasurer, and other officers of the names of all applicants to whom PAs and PLRs are sent.

:

Section F. 2. Upon receipt of the Preliminary Lineage Review form from the applicant and proof of payment, fill out an application worksheet with the approved information on his/her line to such point where the applicant will need to supply documentation, and send it to the applicant.

3. Review all returned application worksheets and documentation. Inform the applicant of any additional documentation that must be received before the application can be approved.
 4. Keep an accurate list of all working applications. This list shall include the date an application worksheet is received, the date the completed application is sent to the applicant for signature, and the date it is sent to the Historian General.
 5. Maintain a complete list of all members and supplements.
 6. Prepare one application, for the signature and acknowledgment of the applicant.
- 7-10 – no changes.

Article VIII- Committees

Section 3 Duties of Standing Committees

C. Bylaws Committee: The Bylaws Committee ...Any and all amendments shall be submitted in writing and accompany the Notice of the Annual Meeting, in accordance with the amending clause in these Bylaws..

D. The Newsletter/Publications Committee....The committee shall be responsible for mailing a copy of the state yearbook and the current newsletter to each new member.

Standing Rules:

The Historian shall be paid at the rate of twenty (\$20.00) each for the processing of original and supplemental applications, upon approval of the application by the General Society and after a copy of the approved application and a welcome letter have been sent to the new member. In the event that an application is rejected, the Historian shall be paid after a copy of the rejected application and an explanation have been sent to the applicant.

11. Junior applications shall be paid at the rate of five dollars (\$5.00) each upon assignment of a TX Junior number, and after a copy of the approved application and welcome letter have been sent to the new Junior member

17. The Society will acquire and maintain appropriate liability insurance for the directors and officers of the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of Texas

18. The Treasurer shall, with two months after the election, furnish, at the expense of the SOMD Texas, a suitable fidelity bond from an acceptable fidelity or guaranty insurance company, payable to SOMD Texas.
