Officer Biographies

Colony Treasurer Diane Christensen




Diane was raised in McFarland, Wisconsin with only 58 in her high school graduating class. She attended Luther College, in Decorah, Iowa, majoring in Music and English. Here she met her husband Lowell. They celebrated their 50th anniversary last year. They lived in Decorah for 27 years, a town of about 5,000 residents. She worked at one of the two banks in town and Lowell managed the local hardware store. She was instrumental in restarting the local Red Cross Chapter and organized many fundraising events as well as helping with many American disasters from flooding to hurricanes, from North Carolina, Iowa and even stationed in San Antonio one time. These experiences helped her understand that at any time you could lose all your material items, but it is your family and friends that are important. For her volunteer work, she received the lowa Red Cross Volunteer of the Year Award. In 2000, they moved to Austin where she worked for a startup internet banking company and later a startup technology company. After retiring in 2020, she had time to pursue her love of genealogy. Her great aunt started it all by keeping notes and pictures of family members. Using this as a springboard, Diane now has two trunks and lots of binders full of information on her family. Her proven passenger is Edward Fuller but she also descends from John Alden, Samuel Fuller, William Mullins, Henry Samson and Myles Standish. Supplementals to SOMD are in her future. She is a member of the Daniel Coleman chapter of DAR and is an enthusiastic volunteer in both of these lineage societies. They have two children: Ryan Thomas lives in Decorah, lowa and has two children, Katie Jane and Brock Thomas and Megan Ruth Venegas lives in Buda with one daughter, Sophia. David was born in a farmhouse in central Missouri. The main crop was strawberries. When he was sixteen, his parents moved the family to Mesa, Arizona, just east of Phoenix. He graduated from Arizona State University with a degree in Education in 1972. After completion of basic training in the Air National Guard, he accepted a full-time position in the base training office. Other positions held were Personnel Data System Manager and Base Personnel Manager. He retired in 2008 as Chief Master Sergeant. He married his wife Susan in 1999. Between them, they have four children and nine grandchildren. They followed the youngest grandchildren to Texas in 2018. As a child he always enjoyed listening to the older relatives talk. He learned how members of his family arrived in Missouri. Some came by ship from Ireland, some from Germany, losing a son on the trip. Others came by horse drawn wagon from Indiana and Illinois. Those old timers would be amazed with what he has learned studying genealogy. Both of his parents had ancestors on the Mayflower. His local grade school was Mayflower Elementary. For most of his life, he associated that name with wildflowers and not his ancestors. He is a member of the Patrick Henry chapter of SAR and serves as their Historian. He participates in a local VFW post. These activities take a minimum of time and leave him free to pursue his favorite activity: flyfishing. He volunteers with Freedom On the Fly. This is a nonprofit group that teaches flyfishing to veterans including casting, fly tying and rod building. They also host flyfishing trips where their primary focus is on disabled veterans. He also enjoys traveling with his wife and spending time with their grandchildren.
